International Workshop "Groups, Rings, Lie and Hopf Algebras. III"

August 13 - 17, 2012

The International Workshop "Groups, Rings, Lie and Hopf Algebras. III" became the main event in the schedule of Atlantic Algebra Centre (AAC) in 2012. It was held at Bonne Bay Marine Station of Memorial University of Newfoundland in Norris Point, NL, Canada on August 13 - 17, 2012. We had 15 international participants (Argentina, Belgium, Brazil, Israel, Italy, Poland, Spain, USA) and 11 Canadians (9 from Atlantic Canada).

A special feature of the workshop was that it was attended by eight students of the AARMS Summer School 2012, which worked for four weeks prior to the Workshop at the Department of Mathematics and Statistics of Memorial University in St. John's. Five of them had their own research results and presented them to the participants of the Workshop as 20 minute research talks.

The Workshop was organized by the members of Atlantic Algebra Centre: Yuri Bahturin, Mikhail Kotchetov, Eduardo Martinez-Pedrosa, Hamid Usefi, with the help of AAC Postdoctoral Fellow Alexei Gordienko and MUN student Jonny Lomond.
